Health Information Management Professional

Specialized in managing patient health information and medical records, administering computer information systems, and classifying using standard coding systems, the diagnoses, and procedures for health care services provided to patients

Human Resources Professional

Human Resources Professionals are responsible for recruiting, screening, interviewing and placing workers. They also handle employee relations, payroll, benefits and training. Human Resources Managers plan, direct and coordinate the administrative functions of an organization.

Information Technologist

Information technologists perform routine database and computer security duties, an information technologist helps keep all the computers in the hospital running efficiently.

Medical Lab Technologist

Medical laboratory technicians assist physicians in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases by performing tests on tissue, blood and other body fluids

Medical Records Transcriptionist

A medical transcriptionist is someone who transcribes doctor's reports from voice recordings, converting them into written reports. The transcriptionist may also edit medical documents, interpret medical abbreviations and terminology.

Occupational Therapist

Occupational therapists treat injured, ill, or disabled patients through the therapeutic use of everyday activities. They help these patients develop, recover, and improve the skills needed for daily living and working.

Pharmacist

Pharmacists distribute drugs prescribed by physicians and other health practitioners and provide information to patients about medications and their use. They advise physicians and other health practitioners on the selection, dosage, interactions, and side effects of medications.

Pharmacy Technician

Under pharmacist supervision, pharmacy technicians: supply medicines to patients, whether on prescription or over the counter. They assemble medicines for prescriptions, provide information to patients and other healthcare professionals.

Physiotherapist

Physiotherapists treat conditions such as sprains, back pain, arthritis, strains, incontinence, bursitis, posture problems, sport and workplace injuries, plus reduced mobility. Rehabilitation following surgery is also included within this category.

Physiotherapy Assistant

Physical therapist assistants (PTAs) provide physical therapy services under the direction and supervision of a licensed physical therapist. PTAs help people of all ages who have medical problems, or other health-related conditions that limit their ability to move and perform functional activities in their daily lives

Radiology Technologist

Radiology technologists are the medical personnel who perform diagnostic imaging examinations and administer radiation therapy treatments. They can specialize in ultrasonography as well.

Registered Dietitian

They influence policy development, direct nutrition programs, manage quality food services and conduct nutrition research.

Registered Nurse (RN)

Registered nurses assist physicians in providing treatment to patients suffering from various medical conditions. They may administer medication, monitor patient recovery and progress, and educate patients and their families on disease prevention and post-hospital treatment.

Registered Practical Nurse (RPN)

RPNs are health care professionals. They combine nursing skill, knowledge and judgment and are experts of nursing care at the bedside.

Rehabilitation Therapy Assistant

Rehabilitation therapy assistants work under occupational and physiotherapists with patients who require therapy and rehabilitation due to injury, disability or disease

Skilled Trades

A tradesman, tradesperson or skilled tradesman refers to a worker that specializes in a particular trade or craft requiring skill; example of include electrician, plumber, millwright.

Speech Pathologist

Speech-language pathologists (SLPs) work to prevent, assess, diagnose, and treat speech, language, social communication, cognitive-communication, and swallowing disorders in children and adults.
