POSITION SUMMARY:

The Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) provides clinical support in both an inpatient and outpatient setting. The SLP works within a multidisciplinary hospital team, providing comprehensive assessment and treatment to those with communication and swallowing disorders, including Modified Barium Swallow studies. Within the smallTalk Program the SLP provides assessment and intervention to preschool children up until their junior kindergarten eligibility, communicating with their family, other health care professionals, schools and community agencies, while maintaining regard for their privacy. The SLP will provide educational opportunities for their clients and families, hospital staff, support high school co-op students, and offer placement opportunities for students in the SLP profession and/or Communicative Disorders Assistant programs. The SLP will provide education to other health professionals through in-services, publications and other continuing education activities.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Master's Degree in Speech-Language Pathology
- Registration with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario
- 1 year post graduate adult and pediatric clinical experience in a hospital setting required.

POSITION-SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES AND TASKS:

- Assessment of wide range of communication difficulties and swallowing difficulties of inpatient and outpatient adults and preschool children to the age of 5 years.
- Analyze assessment information obtained and develop a treatment plan specific to the patient/client
- Determine the appropriate intervention type for specific patients/clients and establish appropriate goals
- Supervise the implementation of mediated therapy (Communicative Disorders Assistant – CDA) for the client's 5 years and younger
- Provide intervention to specific patients/clients as determined
- Participation in client-centered meetings
- Provide education to clients and families, staff and students relevant to the specific communication or swallowing difficulties and/or therapies
- Register outpatients accessing services
- Departmental management duties include budgeting, preparing and submitting statistical reports, supervising supportive personnel, students and volunteers, providing clinical practicum placements for SLP and/or CDA students.
- System functions such as participation in system committees, liaison with other professionals, accreditation working groups and committees.
- Lead, support or participate in key activities or action plans as identified on applicable Operational Plans
- Active member of applicable team/unit/department meetings and huddles
